## **Rifle Range Rules-No Exceptions**

### General

- Members Only, No Guests
- Have Membership Card on you. Membership Card must be shown when requested.
- No alcohol.
- Rifles Only, No Pistols.
- Rifles must be legal for hunting or competition in Pennsylvania.
- Use only frames provided at 50 yards and 100 yards. No other frames.
- All shots must impact the berm. No ground targets.
- No vehicles on range.
- Anyone under 18 years of age must have parent or Jr. Club Instruction with them.
- Houses are beyond range. Keep all rounds in range. You will be held responsible.

### Safety

- No shooting if Farmer is working fields down range.
- All rifles cased or actions open and unloaded until ready to fire.
- Load only ONE ROUND. No clips or magazines allowed. Slow fire only.
- Paper targets only. No bottles, cans, metal wood or anything else.
- No tracers, incendiary, armor piercing or explosive rounds allowed.
- Ask if the line is clear before shooting or going down range to change targets.
- Open and unload all actions and do not handle firearms when someone is down range.
- Shoot from benches only.
- Range closing dates are listed on the bulletin board in middle of range. Take ONE.
- Shooters training for Rifle Competitions must obey the "Competition Rifle Range Rules" posed on the North End Website.

### Everyone Benefits

- Follow all rules or lose your membership.
- If you see anyone not following the rules, DO NOT attempt to stop them. Write down the infraction, description of the person(s), and vehicle and license plate number and mail to North End Rod & Gun Club, 7211 Herber Rd, New Tripoli, PA 18066 or email <add email address here>.
- When finished, clean up trash and brass and place in correct cans.

# Pistol Range Rules-No Exceptions

## General

- Members Only, No Guests
- Have Membership Card on you. Membership Card must be shown when requested.
- No alcohol.
- Pistols Only, nothing else.
- Pistols must be legal for hunting, self-defense or competition in Pennsylvania.
- Use only frames provided. No other frames.
- All shots must impact the berm. No ground targets.
- No vehicles on range.
- Anyone under 18 years of age must have parent or Jr. Club Instructor with them.
- Houses are beyond range. Keep all rounds in range. You will be held responsible.

## Safety

- No shooting if Farmer is working fields down range.
- All pistol actions or cylinders open and unloaded until ready to fire.
- Load no more than 6 rounds.
- Slow fire only (no faster than 1 shot every 10 seconds.) Police may double fire.
- Paper targets only\*. No bottles, cans, metal wood or anything else. \*The Club has provided hanging metal targets that are the only exception to the "paper targets rule."
- No tracers, incendiary, armor piercing or explosive rounds allowed.
- Ask if the line is clear before shooting or going down range to change targets.
- Open and unload all actions and do not handle firearms when someone is down range.
- Range closing dates are listed on the bulletin board in middle of range. Take ONE.

## Everyone Benefits

- Follow all rules or lose your membership.
- If you see anyone not following the rules, DO NOT attempt to stop them. ## Rifle Range Rules-Competition Rifle

Shooters using the range to train for Rifle Competitions must obey the following rules which supplement the normal ranges rules:

- Shooting must be done from the prone, sitting, kneeling or standing positions as defined in the appropriate (smallbore or Highpower) rulebook.
- Rifles and ammo must be legal for the appropriate competition type (NRS, USA Shooting, CMP, etc.).
- Smallbore shooting must be done at 50 or 100 yards.
- Highpower shooting must be done at 100 yards and all bullets must impact the upper berm.
- No rapid-fire. Single load, slow fire only.
- Personal target frames must be used and must conform to the following standards:
  - 50 yards – bottom of target no lower than 16” off ground, top of target no higher than 42”
  - 100 yards-bottom of target no lower than 5” off ground, top of target no higher than 50”
- Do not use the benchrest target frames. The height of these frames is specific for shooting from the benches and not for shooting in the different competition positions/
